Terms and Conditions

1. WPE Ltd reserves the right to reject the whole, or any part of any consignment which does not reach the specified standards of design, material, workmanship and quality.
2. All applicable certificates to be sent with each shipment.
3. Supplier acknowledges WPE's right of access to its facilities, product, and/or related quality records at any time, by WPE, its customer, or regulatory authorities to verify quality of products or work. Right of access may be limited to only those records and product applicable to WPE's products or contracts.
4. Further sub-contracting of services or processes may only be undertaken with written permission from WPE Ltd. Where sub-tier suppliers have been utilised all applicable requirements of the order and these conditions must be imposed upon such suppliers. All purchasing requirements shall be flowed down to sub-tier suppliers or subcontractors.
5. Supplier to notify WPE immediately of unexpected anomalies, nonconformance's, changes in product and/or in process, changes of suppliers, changes of manufacturing facility location, change in ownership, name changes, or change in senior company management and/or change in quality leadership, and changes to system or controlled processes certification status, including suspensions or disapprovals. Notification must be prior to relocation and with adequate time for hardware, system, and process re-qualification.
6. Supplier acknowledges it shall apply suitable corrective action when presented with WPE complaints or nonconformance reports.
7. Supplier shall implement and maintain a quality management system that meets the requirements of their specified standard.
8. Supplier shall have a procedure in place to prevent the use of counterfeit parts and materials, and shall ensure that no counterfeit parts or material are used in the processing of WPE products.
9. Supplier shall ensure all staff working on WPE product are aware of their contribution to product conformity and product safety.
10. Records pertaining to the manufacture, inspection and test of WPE's products shall be retained for a minimum of fifteen (15) years. After this fifteen-year period the records shall be offered to WPE.



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11. Goods supplied shall conform to the Health and Safety at Work act 1974 and all local and national environmental controls. WPE must be informed in writing IN ADVANCE of delivery of potential hazards to the environment or health and safety those goods may have, and subsequent packaging of those items must clearly display those hazards and precautions to be taken.
